

SPELLING TEST

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Say the test word, followed by the sentence containing the word and then say the test word again.
- Do not provide any feedback as to the accuracy of the student's spelling.
- Continue until 8-10 consecutive words are spelled incorrectly.
- Count the number of words spelled correctly. Use the scoring table to covert this score to years and months

Example: If the student scores 25 words correct, find the intersection between the 20 on the left hand column and the 5 on the top row. The score is 7.06 = 7 years and 6 months.
